Theory and practice

Prerequisites:

Relevant mechanical / hydraulic background.

Target group:

Operating and maintenance personnel who use hose crimping equipment.

Maintenance personnel must be able to carry out preventive inspections and maintenance on hydraulic hoses and be able to install new hoses.

Course content:

- 01. Couplings and hoses in a hydraulic system.
- 02. Couplings in accordance with ISO 8434, operation and assembly.
- 03. Threads, flanges and sealing principles.
- 04. Measurement and measurement specifications.
- 05. Selection of hoses and hose types.
- 06. Measuring, cutting, peeling, pressing and other use of tools.
- 07. Use of an interpreter to check that the pressing has the correct internal collapse.
- 08. Use of calipers to check ferrules and outside measurements.
- 09. Control of completed pressing.
- 10. Inspection and maintenance of hoses / Damage analyses.
- 11. Information about specific customer requirements, e.g. Statoil's TR 1803
- 12. Requirements for hoses and fittings on-/offshore.
- 13. Demonstrate pressure testing of hoses. Properly crimped and damaged hose.
- 14. Practical pressure test.
